15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Multidisciplinary/ Interdisciplinary study environment is significant to the academic atmosphere of the college. Sapatgram College aspires to become an all-inclusive multidisciplinary institution, and in this respect, the college has introduced Skill Hub Initiative (A Vocation Centre) under PMKVY 4.0 scheme of NSDC, where the regular students along with school dropout students are given opportunity to learn various employable skills along with their traditional bookish knowledge system of education. Moreover, the college has undertaken Memorandum of Understanding with various Colleges and Universities, under which various Faculty and students exchange programmes are organised to give the students an opportunity to opt for courses from any stream from any institution and thereby promote multidisciplinary education system. The college allows students to choose Generic Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses across disciplines. Being affiliated to Gauhati University, Sapatgram College faces constraints when it comes to curriculum design as the University is the sole authority to design curriculum. However, students from a variety of streams and subjects may choose to enroll in a few add-on courses designed and offered by various departments of the college. The college has arranged several multidisplinary seminars, webinars, special talk etc. The college provide many subject combination to our students to opt for as per the guidelines formulated by the Gauhati University. Equity and inclusion through a range of measures has been initiated for including greater opportunities for public education, supervision of scholarship for disadvantage and unprivileged students. Moreover, the college has undertaken some initiatives for career progression of the students belonging to various departments. The interdisciplinary classes has been arranged by some departments to develop the multidisciplinary environment in the college. Different Departmets of the college have introduced multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary Add-on courses.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

As Sapatgram College is a constituent college to Gauhati University and completely follows the curriculum framework and syllabi as approved by the University from time to time. The college has registered the students in the Academic Bank of Credit portal i.e., (www.abc.gov.in) as a constituent institute of Gauhati University to enable its students' mobility across various higher educational institutions.

17.Skill development:

The college has introduced Skill Hub Initiative (A vocational centre) under PMKVY 4.0 of NSDC (National Skill Development Corporation), under which four Skill Development Courses are imparted such as 1. Self-employed Tailor, 2. Professional Make-up Artist 3. Electrical Technician & 4. Associate Senior Desktop publishing. Both the regular Students ("inschool" students in the language of NSDC) as well as outsiders, unemployed and school dropouts ("outschool" students in the language of NSDC) can opt for these courses which are absolutely free. The college has already conducted skill enhancement classes as per the present requirement. The college also encourages the soft skill development of the students by arranging lectures by resource person from different fields and has established a Incubation Centre in the college campus. Besides CBCS, the college provides computer training courses and encourages entrepreneurship through different workshop programmes in order to embrace skill development. The college has organised workshop on mushroom cultivation and uplifted a self-financed micro-project on mushroom cultivation, organised workshops and training programmes on handicrafts to develop traditional knowlege system, and upgrade their knowlege with modern technologies etc.

The college has four Language departments as approved by the university such as (i) Bodo (ii) Bengali (iii) Assamese (iv) English, and all these departments offer full programs or courses in different programs which deal with India Languages, Culture, Knowledge System among other topics. In addition to these departments the college faculty also have interest and research work in these areas to aid students develop understanding about our traditional philosophy. The college regularly encourages its faculty to enhance their knowledge in these areas by attending FDP, Refresher courses, seminars and conferences and

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also by organizing these for the benefit of all faculty from different institution across India. The college has made several efforts to integrate Indian Knowledge System in its course unit. The billingual method as the medium of teaching is used in our college. The college celebrates many commemorative days to make the students aware of Indian culture and heritage. As a part of it, offline Yoga training implemented in the college to inculcate the Indian cultural value among the students. Moreover, the college has arranged excursion programmes to impart Indian Knowledge base among the students and sense of integrity as a responsible citizen of India. The college has taken initiatives to revive endangered regional Indian languages by introducing AddOn Courses e.g., "Certificate Course on Rajbongshi Basha".

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The college has followed the Focus on Outcome based Education Policy which helps our college to keep record of results of the students through academic audit and mentor mentee system. Course Otcomes and Programme Outcomes are discussed by the faculty members from time to time. During the pandemic, virtual tours were explored by several departments. Successful alumni are invited to share their experiences with the existing students to highlight the Outcome based Education system. All the Departments of the college organise an interaction programme between teacher and students on desired outcome of the courses.

20.Distance education/online education:

To promote distance and online education, the college has subscribed to Google suite including all Google tools like Google Meet, Jamboard, Google Classroom, Google Calendar, Cisco Webex free version to develop and deliver the entire teaching learning process in an online environment in addition to traditional chalk and talk teaching method. All the online classes were held by using Online college portal and also through google classrooms. Assignments and evaluations are also done through online by some departments. Several webinars were oraganized by the college through Cisco Webex, google meet etc. Study materials were uploaded by the faculty members on college website. Even after the college resumes, several online practices are still exercised. Our college is the member of NLIST-INFLIBNET for providing e-resources to the students and the faculty members. Moreover, the college has a Centre for Distance education under Gauhati University known as IDOL. Under this course, various departments conducted PG Courses such as M.A. in Political Science, English, Economics, History, Education,

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Philosophy, Mathematics, Assamese and Bengali. The students take admission in Gauhati University and the college organize the classes only on Sunday.

The IQAC prepares the academic calendar. Faculty members prepare the lesson plan and action plan and submit monthly progress report in the first week of every months. Course completion certificates are collected from the faculty members and feedbaks are taken from the students before the commencement of end-semester examination. At the beginning of the academic session, students undergo Induction and Orientation program, where career counselor and academic experts guideand encourage students for creating a better career. The faculties of each subjects make students aware about Course Outcomes which are defined for each course. According to university guidelines, there are two semesters, odd and even in a year for graduation courses. The College has waste management tank for solid waste, liquid waste, and e-waste. Dustbins are installed atnook and corner of the campus and wastes are collected from the dustbins anddecomposed in the waste management tanks. Most of the waste collected is biodegradable. The minimal amount of nonbiodegradable is mostly burnt in the pits. The biodegradable portion too is dumped in the pits for decomposition over time. The solid biodegradable waste collected from the parks, playground and surrounding areas and dumped in the pits for decomposition. Fallen dry leaves of the campus are collected and dumped for decomposition and used as manure for plants. There are provisions of separate dustbins for separate wastes such as degradable and non-degradable, Biomedical waste, E-waste wastes in the college campus. Different wastes are kept separately in different dustbins. In addition, Sapatgram College has signed a MOU with Sapatgram Municipality Board (SMB) for management of nondegradable solid waste such as Biomedical waste management, Ewaste and also

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for Waste recycling system, Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management generated within the college campus. The SMB has it own recycling unit for management of Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste. The SMB waste collecting vehicle comes to the college campus to collect and carry all types of nondegradable solid wasteincluding Biomedical waste management, Ewaste from college campus& hostel to their waste recycling unit for appropriate waste management. The principal concerned is being asked to give report (Annual Progress Report of last 3 years) where in the general performance, conduct and character is being evaluated and appraised. The minimal amount of nonbiodegradable is mostly burnt in the pits. The biodegradable portion too is dumped in the pits for decomposition over time. The solid biodegradable waste collected from the parks, playground and surrounding areas and dumped in the pits for decomposition. Fallen dry leaves of the campus are collected and dumped for decomposition and used as manure for plants. There are provisions of separate dustbins for separate wastes such as degradable and non-degradable, Biomedical waste,

E-waste wastes in the college campus. Different wastes are kept separately in different dustbins. In addition, Sapatgram College has signed a MOU with Sapatgram Municipality Board (SMB) for management of nondegradable solid waste such as Biomedical waste management, Ewaste and also for Waste recycling system, Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management generated within the college campus. The SMB has it own recycling unit for management of Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste. The SMB waste collecting vehicle comes to the college campus to collect and carry all types of nondegradable solid wasteincluding Biomedical waste management, Ewaste from college campus& hostel to their waste recycling unit for appropriate waste management. The SMB charges a nominal amount of monthly fees form the college authority for against this invaluable service.
