

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Sapatgram College, a pioneering institution of higher learning in Bilasipara West Constituency, was established on 7th August, 1972. It was started at the initiative of some local people interested in dissemination of higher education in this economically backward area. The college came into existence as a result of the untiring efforts and sacrifices of some of the leading personalities of the area like Late Panchanan Badhuri, Late Panchanan Medhi, Late Indubhusan Bhadra, Late Sunilal Narzary, Sri Santosh Kumar Dutta, Sri Samar Kanti Poit, Mr. P.K. Das, Mr A. Bhaduri, Mr Pabitra Kr. Das, Sri Ranajit Saha, Md. Sirajuddin Ahmed and others.



Initially the college functioned from the Kachari building of the Zamindar of Parbatjoar situated in Ward No. 1 of Sapatgram Town on the 7th August 1972. Later on, it was shifted to its present site. Then Late Lilananda Thakur (commonly known as Pagal Baba) donated a building along with 1 (one) bigha of land to the College which helped the college a lot in the initial period. The College is, at present, spread over an area of 25 (twenty five) bighas of land in the Sonamoyee Gaon Panchayat on the banks of the river Loska, allotted to the College by the Government of Assam. The College was accorded affiliation by Gauhati University in 1980-81. Subsequently, it was brought under the Deficit Grants- in- Aid system on the 1st September 1983 due to the active help of Late Ranendra Narayan Basumatary, ExCabinet Minister of Assam. The College was recognized by the University Grants Commission under Section 2(f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956 in July, 2002. In December, 2004 the college was assessed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore and was accorded the grade C++. The College came under Provincialisation Act from 1st December 2005. Conforming to the National Pattern of Education (10+2+3 system), this full-fledged Degree College imparts two-year Higher Secondary and three-year Degree courses of studies in Arts stream and one year Regular PGDCA Course. The college has undergone the 2nd cycle of assessment by NAAC, Bangalore and has been accorded the Grade B with CGPA 2.52 in February, 2016.

The present campus is spread over a little more than 25 Bighas of land. The campus is beautifully interspersed with gardens and different plants. The campus is eco friendly with a great scenic beauty. The college has infrastructural facilities for all departments with well equipped library and wi fi connectivity.



VISION:

 The vision of Sapatgram College is to transform this institution into a centre of excellence of higher learning by continuous working towards making education socially relevant and meaningful.

Admission Procedure:

Issuing application for admission into all classes/ courses begins with the notification issued by the principal immediately after the announcement of respective results in the college Notice Board and college website (sapatgramcollege.org), and the Form and the Prospectus for admission can be obtained from the college office on payment of the prescribed fee and the intending candidates are required to submit the filled in forms within prescribed time limit .Applications are processed and finalized by the "Admission Committee". The list of selected candidates are displayed in the college notice board and the selected candidates are to get themselves admitted accordingly failing which the selection stands cancelled The college does not entertain applications for admission received after the last date of submission. The applicants have to submit self attested copies of relevant certificates along with the applications. Incomplete forms are rejected. A Prospectus is supplied along with the application form. Applicants have to bring original certificates for verification at the time of admission and students availing free admission udner BPL Category have to submit the original certificate and marksheet in the College Office.

COLLECTION OF FEES

As a part of the attempt to go for cashless mode of transaction. All fees shall be collected through UCO Bank, Sapatgram Branch. Students are required to fill in challan in triplicate in prescribed form for payment of fees. The first copy of the Challan is to be retained by the bank. The second copy of the same is required to be produced before the Cash Counter of the college. On receipt of the same the college furnishes its own Receipt acknowledging the receipt of fees. The third copy of the challan is to be retained by the student concerned for future reference. Payment may also be made through cheque favoouring Sapatgram College, UCO Bank, Sapatgram Branch, Account No. - 04040100003620 & IFS Code-UCOA0000404. Fees once paid are not refundable. Fee structure may be changed as per Govt. Notification.

Registration and Migration -

Registration 's Compulsory for all students on submission of prescribed forms after admission under A.H.S.E.C. or G. U. and students from Board, Council or Universities other than S.E.B.A., A.H.S.E.C. or G.U. shall have to produce Migration Certificates at the time of admission.

Academic Regulations:

The college follows the regulation prepared by A.H.S.EC and G.U. being in force from time to time in respect of concerned Courses.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:-

- 1. Identity Card is mandatory for all the students during college hours.
- 2. The student must wear College Uniform in the College campus during the college hours. The college uniform shall be of the following specification –

- 3. Attendence of the students in classes as well as in academic activities is mandatory. Class attendance shall be counted and published every month by each Department.
- 4. Ragging in any form strictly prohibited. Any one found guilty of ragging or aveting, it is punishable as per order of Hounarble Supreme Courte of India.
- 5. Students shall abide by the rules and regulations prescribed by the college authority.
- 6. A student shall be subjected to disciplinary action if he/she is found to be disobedient or indecent in his/her behavior with the teachers, other employees & students and with the college authority.
- 7. A student who is found to have violated college rules and regulations shall be liable to expulsion.
- 8. No notice or leaflet can be circulated anywhere in the college premises without the prior approval of the College Authority.

TEACHING AND EVALUATION

The college follows the ACADEMIC CALENDAR of G.U. for under graduate and of A.H.S.E.C. for H.S. courses and is subject to G.U. and A.H.S.E.C. course regulations respectively. Besides, the college has got its own academic calendar showing total no of working days, teaching days, date and times for various Internal Examinations. The college has its own mechanism for evaluating the performance of the students for continuous evaluation and thereby maintaining quality education. The college has shown excellent results all along.

In addition to normal class room teaching, the college imparts teaching by organizing seminars, departmental seminars, tutorial classes, mentoring classes etc. The Evaluation process is continuous and based on the students progress in class assignments, unit test, laboratory works (for Education subject), field works and examinations. Evaluation process of students' performance in TDC classes shall be based on the regulation of G.U. as framed from time to time. The internal Evaluation will carry maximum 20% weightage and shall be a continuos process through Sessional Examinations, Home assignment(s), Seminar(s), Co-cuuricular activities and Incentive for Attendance in class.

FACILITIES

Class Rooms:

22 classrooms, both big and small, are available for taking theoretical and Education Major Practical Classes.

There are 10 large Class Rooms for Higher Secondary classes and Degree Course General Classes and 12 small Class

Rooms for Degree Major and Practical Classes.

* Indoor Stadium cum Auditorium:

The college has built an Indoor Stadium with UGC grant having provision for Badminton, Volleyball and other indoor games. The gallery can accommodate more than 700 audience. In the absence of an auditorium, the Indoor Stadium is being used as an Auditorium. There is a large stage in the building and as an auditorium it can accommodate more than 1500 audience.



Students' Common Room:

There are separate Common Rooms for boys and girls with adequate toilet facilities and indoor games like table tennis, carom, chess etc. The Girls' Common Room is situated on the 2nd Floor of the Administrative Building with the provision of running water in the toilets and filtered drinking water. The Boys' Common Room is provided with drinking water and toilet facility.

. Drinking Water:

The college has taken adequate steps to provide safe drinking water to the students. There are online ultraviolet water purifiers in the Girls' Common Room, Central Library and Teachers' Common Room. Besides, a water cooler fitted to an online ultraviolet water purifier has been put for the use of all under the staircase of the Administrative Building. This comes as a boon to the students during the summer.

· Toilets:

The college has provided toilets in Girls' Common Room and Boys' Common Room. Besides, there is a separate toilet for boys. There are toilets in the Teachers' Common Room Principal's Room, Conference Room for teachers, Conference Hall, the Central Library and the Office Room. The toilet in the Central Library is specifically meant for the female teachers and staff. All the toilets are cleaned regularly by a sweeper appointed by the college.

Internet with wi-fi facility:

Internet facility has been provided to the students and teachers in the Central Library, Network Resource Centre and the Computer Centre of the college. There are 4 computers in the Central Library, 2 computers in the Network Resource Centre and 4 computers in the Computer Centre with internet facility which remain open to the students and teachers from 9.00 A.M to 4.30 P.M. The browsing and downloading in these computers are free of cost. Wi-fi facility is also accessible in the College Campus.





. Canteen:

College canteen remains open from 9am to 5pm. It is under the supervision of a contractor who is generally an ex-student of this college. There is a Canteen Supervisory Cell which looks after the smooth running of the canteen, regulates the prices of food items and inspects the quality of the food items. The canteen has sitting arrangement for students and teachers,



Sports Activity:

The college has its athletics and sports equipments. One part time qualified Physical Education Teacher has been appointed to train the students in football, volleyball, cricket, gymnastics, high jump, long jump and other games and sports activities.

. Study Tour:

The Departments organize Study Tours for their students to places of historical cultural and educational importance. The college organizes an environmental Study Tour for the students of 4th Semester as part of their syllabus of environmental Studies. In such study tours the male and female teachers of the college accompany the students for maintaining discipline among them and to elaborate the historical/ cultural / environmental significance of the places visited. Following the instruction of G.U. and AHSEC the collage arrenges classes on Environmental Studies.

. Literary Activity:

Sapatgram College Magazine is published annually. It publishes the literary writings, views and opinions of students and teachers. Some of the Departments have their Wall Magazines which carry the poems, articles, cartoons and paintings of the students. Some of the Departments publish their Annual Journals which contain the research papers of the students presented in the Seminar Classes. All such efforts are aimed at bringing out the latent creative and critical talent in the budding students.



. Quiz and Debate:

There is a Debating Society in the college which organizes debates, extempore speeches and quiz competitions among the students from time to time and prizes are given to the winners on the Final Day Function of the College Week. All such activities are conducted with an aim of bringing out the latent talent in the students. The students of the college have won prizes in the quiz and debate competitions held at the sub-divisional and district levels by the Govt. of Assam.

• Music and Dance:

Music and dance are encouraged by the college. Of course, these are not actively promoted by the college because of lack of space and time. Competitions of music and dance are conducted during the College Week and the winners are awarded prizes and certificates on the Final Day Function of the College Week. The recognized singers and dancers are encouraged to perform in different meetings, workshops, seminars and functions of the college. Thus such talent is recognized by the college.





Scouts and Guides:

Scouts and Guides was introduced in the college in 2004. The boys are encouraged to join Scouts as Rovers and the girls are encouraged to join Guides as Rangers. Dr. Padma Guha Agarwala, Associate Professor, is the Ranger Leader (H.W.B) and Mr. Abdul Rezzak Sheikh, Assistant Professor, is the Rover Leader. The main motto of Scouts and Guides is to build the students as good citizens by inculcating in them the sense of discipline, sense of self-sufficiency and the value of dignity of labour. The physical activities help the students in shaping their physical health and the cultural activities bring out the latent talent in them. The Rangers and Rovers of the college are engaged in maintaining discipline, law and order in the functions in the college and also in the meetings, and functions in the neighbouring areas. Miss Nur Akhtara Begum and Ms. Gitarani Kalita were awarded the Rashtrapati Award for Ranger Testing conducted by the National Headquarter, Bharat Scouts and Guides, New Delhi in 2010. They received awards from

Mrs. Pratibha Devi Singh Patil, Hon'ble President of India at Rashtrapati Bhavan in 2011. Mr. Ali Rahosan, Mr. Ratan Kr. Roy and Mr. Rituparna Sarma under the leadership of Mr. Abdul Rezak Sheikh (Advance Course), Assistant Professor were awarded Rastrapati Award for Rover Testing conducted by the National Headquarter, Bharat Scouts and Guides, New Delhi in 2016. They received awards from Mr. Pranab Kr. Mukherjee, Hon'ble President of India at Rashtrapati Bhawan on 12th August, 2016. Mention may be noted altogether 14 Rovers & Rangers received Rajya Puraskar (State Level) from Mr. Banowarilal Purohit, Governor of Assam on 10th May, 2017.

. Students' Union:

Sapatgram College Students' Union Council is the elected body of representatives of the students. Each year the election to the posts of Vice-President, General Secretary, Asst. General Secretary, Secretary- Major Games, Secretary-Minor Games, Secretary-Debate & Culture, Social Service Secretary, Secretary-Boys' Common Room and Secretary-Girls' Common Room of SCSUC is held in the month of October and the elected representatives assume office and remain in power for one year, i.e. up to the newly elected representatives assume office. The Principal is the President of SCSUC. Teachers are appointed as Professor In-Charge against different portfolios and the Secretaries

perform their activities under the active supervision of the teachers.

National Service Scheme:

NSS has been introduced in the college from the academic session 2015-16. 100 students of the college have joined it as volunteers.



· Recreation:

The college takes steps in organizing music and dance shows by the students and by experts from outside. Prominent folk-singers are invited to perform before students in order to inculcate in the students a love for their own cultural heritage.

Students' Aid Fund:

Applications are invited from poor and meritorious students at the beginning of every academic session which are scrutinized by the Students' Aid Fund Committee and scholarships are given to the deserving students on the basis of merit out of the collection of Students' Aid Fund.

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Discipline

The college believes that the objective of imparting education to the students can be achieved only in a conducive atmosphere for such activities. In that case, the students have to be highly disciplined and punctual. Hence, the college maintains discipline in the campus. A Grade-IV employee at the entry gate does not allow the students without uniform and Identity Card to enter the campus. This is done in order to check the entry of trouble shooters. Any kind of indiscipline in the classroom and in the campus is strictly dealt with. The Class Management and Academic Atmosphere Supervisory Cell takes active steps in this regard.

Departmental Rooms:

Most of the Departments have been provided separate Departmental Rooms and only 4 Departments have been shifted to the newly constructed Teachers' Common Room. Computers have been provided to most of the Departments and the computers in the newly constructed Teachers' Common Room have been provided Internet facility.

Career Counselling Cell:

Counselling of students in the choice of subjects in General and Major Courses during admission and in the choice of career options to fresh graduates is an important aspect of every institution of higher education. Sapatgram College has a Career Counselling Cell which organizes counselling of students before admission regarding choice of subjects in General and Major Courses. It also organizes seminars and workshops in career counselling of fresh graduates regarding career options. Mr. Indranil Sarkar, Associate Professor in the Department of English, is the Coordinator of the Career Counselling Cell.

Staff Quarters:

The Principal's Quarters have been built with UGC grant in the college campus. There is a plan to build some staff quarters for the teachers.

Communicative English:

The Department of English conducts a 3 months Certificate Course in Communicative

English for the interested students. The classes are conducted by the faculty of the Department after regular classes and on Sundays and holidays. The students have to pay only a Registration fee of Rs.200/- for the course which is utilized for purchase of study materials and stationery items. The course is conducted twice in a year and 20 students are selected on the basis of merit and aptitude for each course. Mr. Indranil Sarkar, Associate Professor in the Department of English, is the Coordinator of the Certificate Course.

Computer Centre:

The Computer Centre, situated on the 2nd floor of the Administrative Building, conducts a number of computer courses. The Basic Course in Computer Application has been made compulsory for H.S 1st Year students since 2008-09 academic session. The certificates to the successful students are given by the college. There are other courses such as Certificate Course in Computer Application (6 months) and Diploma in Accounts & Finance (6 months) conducted by this centre. At present there are 24 computers in the Computer Centre. The centre also successfully conducts PGDCA Course under Gauhati University since 2009-10.

· School Adaption:

The college has enthusiastically adopted a school, namely Lokopriya High School, Rabantari under Sonamoyi Gram Panchayat as a part of its outreach services by tacking classes in the area of the weakness in the school. As per its plan, the college is taking every necessary step towards cleanliness drive, charity, organising health camp and plantation etc.







" Grievance Redressal Cell:

The Grievance Redressal Cell, Sapatgram College remains active throughout the year and remains more vigilant at the commencement of every academic session in order to prevent any kind of ragging of the freshers. There is a Grievance Box in front of the Principal's Office which is opened at 4.00 P.M every day. The Principal, who is the Convener of the Cell, holds a meeting of the cell to discuss the grievances received and the cell tries to redress the grievances of the students.

Smart Class Room:

with the grant from State Government in 2015-16. Some of the classes are held in this room where interactive sessions are held. Such things have immensely benefited the students.

· Guest House:

The college has constructed a Guest House out of the UGC grants. The Guest House was a necessity of the college in this rural area.

Central Library

Central Library, Sapatgram College has been trying its best to provide efficient service to the readers. The Library has been aiming at supplementing the knowledge of the students which they acquire from their teachers. Central Library,

Sapatgram College is well stocked with more than 17000 texts and reference books, more than a dozen of local and national journals and a few newspapers and other information sources like maps, globes CD-ROMs etc. It is situated on the 1st floor of the Administrative Building with a Reading Hall for students and a Reading Room for teachers. The library follows open access system and it remains open from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM on the working days. Students get membership at the time of their admission in the college. But they have to apply separately to obtain library cards. All teaching and non-teaching staff are also members of the library.

Efforts are on to include the alumni and interested people of the local society as members of the Central Library on the deposit of caution money.

Library Card:

Each student is issued on library card and borrow two books at a time. Students should return the books within 15 days from the date of issue. Student must abide by the rules & regulation of the library for the greater interest of the college.







Women's Hostel:

Sapatgram College has a Women's Hostel constructed with the UGC grants in two phases. The Women's Hostel is situated within the college campus in a healthy and secured environment. It is adjacent to the Principal's Quarter. Another Hostel is under construction. The hostel has its own set of rules and regulations which are strictly mandatory for all the boarders. Extention Education -

Recognising extensiion education as the third dimension of the Institution, the College encourages the students and the faculty members to undertake such extension works and programmes as will make education socially relevant by promoting a meaningful and sustained rapport between the Institution and the Community surrounding it and by enriching their teaching-learning process through exposure to community needs, problems and issues.

Fee structure for Admission -

Students seeking admission in various courses in the colleges will have to pay fees as per Government of Assam's notifications and it will be notified as and when received from Government. Uniform fee structure will be maintain as per Guideline of Govt. in this regard. In addition to the admission fees fixed by the Government, the students will have to pay an extra amount for the self financing courses.

Regulations of TDC for Semester System

- TDC shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years. The schedule for Semester System shall be as shown below:
 - (a) First, Third and Fifth Semester: August 1- December 31. (including Examinations)
 - (b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester: January 1 June 30. (including Examinations)
 - (c) Semester Break: July 1 July 31.
- Students' performance should be monitored throughout the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical course. Evaluation of the students' performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following:

Internal Evaluation: 10/15/20/25 Marks & External Evaluation: 40/60/80/75 Marks

- ♦ Internal Evaluation should be based on two Sessional examinations. Home Assignments, seminars and library work in each Semester.
- External Evaluation should be through a final examination at the end of the Semester.
- The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and that in each practical paper is 40%.
- In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
- A student who could not appear or failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:
 - (a) First semester with the regular third Semester Examination.
 - (b) Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester Examination.
 - (c) Third Semester with regular Fifth Semester Examination.
 - (d) Fourth Semester with Regular Sixth Semester Examination.
- A student may be allowed to "repeat" any one of the theory papers in the First Second, Third and Fourth Semester and may be allowed for "betterment" of marks in one paper in the Fifth Semester, provided the student secures less than 45% marks in the paper.
- No "repeat"/"betterment" shall be allowed in the practical examinations in any semester.
- A student must pass all his examinations, including 'repeat' and 'betterment' chances, within five years from the date of admission to the First Semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular Semester.
- ♦ In case of any dispute regarding evaluation or unforeseen events the matter may be placed in the appropriate Committee of the University for amicable Settlement.
- Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.
- For any matter not covered under this Regulation for Semester System, the existing University Rules and the Gauhati University Act 1949 (as amended till date) should be applicable.
