ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Sapatgram College, a pioneering institution of higher learning in Bilasipara West Constituency, was established on 7th August, 1972. It was started at the initiative of some local people interested in dissemination of higher education in this economically backward area. The college came into existence as a result of the untiring efforts and sacrifices of some of the leading personalities of the area like Late Panchanan Badhuri, Late Panchanan Medhi, LateIndubhusan Bhadra, Late Sunilal Narzary, Sri Santosh Kumar Dutta, Sri Samar Kanti Poit, Mr. P.K. Das, Mr A. Bhaduri, Mr Pabitra Kr. Das, Sri Ranajit Saha, Md. Sirajuddin Ahmed and others.

Initially the college functioned from the Kachari building of the Zamindar of Parbatjoar situated in Ward No. 1 of SapatgramTown on the 7th August 1972. Later on, it was shifted to its present site. Then Late Lilananda Thakur, popularly known as Pagal Baba, donated a building along with 1 (one) bigha of land to the College which helped the college a lot in the initial period. The College is, at present, spread over an area of 25 (twenty five) bighas of land in the Sonamoyee Gaon Panchayat on the banks of the river Loska, allotted to the College by the Government of Assam. The College was accorded affiliation by Gauhati University in 1980-81. Subsequently, it was brought under the Deficit Grants- in- Aid system on the 1st September 1983 due to the active help of Late Ranendra Narayan Basumatary, Ex-Cabinet Minister of Assam. The College was recognized by the University Grants Commission under Section 2(f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956 in July, 2002. In December, 2004 the college was assessed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore and was accorded the grade C++. The College came under Provincialisation Act from 1st December 2005. Conforming to the National Pattern of Education (10+2+3 system), this full-fledged Degree College imparts two-year Higher Secondary and three- year Degree courses of studies in Arts stream and one year Regular PGDCA Course. The college has undergone the 2nd cycle of assessment by NAAC, Bangalore and was accredited Grade B with CGPA 2.52 in February, 2016.

The present campus is spread over a little more than 25 Bighas of land. The campus is beautifully interspersed with gardens and different plants. The campus is ecofriendly with a great scenicbeauty. The college has infrastructural facilities for all departments with well equipped library and wi fi connectivity. It has a Canteen, Guest House, Indoor Stadium, two Women's Hostels and a Solar Plant.

About Four Years Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP)

Four years Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) has been introduced from the academic session 2023-24 as per NEP-2020. There are eight semesters in UG courses over a period of four calendars years.

The schedule for the semester system is as follows:

First, third, fifth, seventh Semester (including examination): August to December Second, fourth, sixth, eight Semester (including examination): January to June

In FYUGP, broadly there are two programmes:

B.A (Honours): One major- two minors

B.A (Without Honours): Three minors

In FYUGP, students have the option to exit the programme after 3 years. If one exits after three years in Honours programme, Student will get a Bachelor's Degree with Major. If a student completes the whole 4- year, student will get Bachelor's Degree with Honours.

In FYUGP, There are two courses: core course and common course: In core course students have to select 3 subjects as per their choice. Bachelor's Degree with Major Bachelor's Degree with Honours

Common course is same for all students. In Common course, different Skill Enhancement Course, Multidisciplinary course Ability enhancement course and Value-added courses are offered

Admission Procedure:

Issuing application for admission into all classes/courses begins with the notification issued by the principal immediately after the announcement of respective results in the college Notice Board and college website (www.sapatgramcollege.in) and the Form and the Prospectus for admission can be obtained from our College Website and also from our Online Admission Portal(www.sapatgramcollegeonline.co.in/www.darpan.ahseconline.in/www.assamadmission.sam arth.ac.in). The intending candidates are asked to download the prospectus which is free of cost and to submit the online filled forms along with all required documents within prescribed time limit. Applications are scrutinized and finalized by the "Admission Committee". The lists of selected candidates are displayed on the college website and the selected candidates are to get themselves admitted accordingly, failing which the selection stands cancelled. The college will not entertain any other mode of applications for admission except online mode and after the last date of submission.

Selection Procedure:

Selection is made on the basis of merit. A list of the selected candidates for admission is notified on the college website. The details procedure of online admission and their supporting documents which to be submitted along with application form will be notified in the College website after getting the Govt. of Assam guidelines.

Reservation of Seats:

There is a provision for reservation of seats belonging to S.C, S.T(P), S. T (H), O.B.C. and M. O.B. C. and physically handicapped categories as per Government Rules. The candidates have to produce valid certificates issued by the competent authorities.

COLLECTION OF FEES

As per govt. of Assam guidelines.

Academic Regulations:

The college follows the regulation prepared by A.H.S.E.C and G.U. being in force from time to time in respect of concerned Courses.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:-

- 1. Identity Card is mandatory for all the students during college hours.

- 3. Students shall abide by the rules and regulations prescribed by the college authority.
- 4. A student shall be subjected to disciplinary action if he/she is found to be disobedient or indecent in his/her behavior with the teachers, other employees & students and with the college authority.
- 5. A student who is found to have violated college rules and regulations shall be liable to expulsion.
- 6. No notice or leaflet can be circulated anywhere in the college premises without the prior approval of the Principal.
- 7. Ragging in any form strictly prohibited. Anyone found guilty of ragging or averting, it is punishable as per order of Honourable Supreme Court of India.

TEACHING AND EVALUATION

The college follows the ACADEMIC CALENDER of G.U. for graduate and of A.H.S.E.C. for H.S. course and is subject to G.U. and A.H.S.E.C. course regulation respectively. Besides, the college has got its own academic calendar showing total number of working days, teaching days, date and time for various Internal Examination. The college has its own mechanism to evaluate the performances of the students for continuous evaluation and thereby maintaining quality education. The college has shown excellent results all along.

In addition to normal class room teaching, the college imparts teaching by organizing seminars, departmental seminars, tutorial classes etc. The Evaluation process is continuous and based on the student's progress in class assignments, unit test.

FACILITIES

Class Rooms:

22 classrooms, both big and small, are available for taking theoretical and Education Major Practical Classes. There are 7 large Class Rooms for Higher Secondary classes and Degree Course General Classes and 15 small Class Rooms for Degree Major and Practical Classes including 3 smart class rooms.

• Mini Indoor Stadium

The college has built an Indoor Stadium with UGC grant having provision for

Badminton, Volleyball and other indoor games. The gallery can accommodate more than 700 audiences.

• Community Hall cum auditorium: The College has a well furnished Community Hall cum auditorium in the college campus which is constructed under WPT ministry, govt. of Assam. Various cultural programme, Seminar, conference, Symposium etc. are organized in that hall.

• Students' Common Room:

There are separate Common Rooms for boys and girls with adequate toilet facilities and indoor games like table tennis, carom, chess etc. The Girls' Common Room is situated on the 2nd Floor of the Administrative Building with the provision of running water in the toilets and filtered drinking water. The Boys' Common Room is situated adjacent to the Indoor Stadium with toilet facility. Steps are being taken to provide running water to it. Filters have been provided there for drinking water.

Drinking Water:

The college has taken adequate steps to provide safe drinking water to the students. There are water purifiers in the Girls' Common Room, Central Library and Teachers' Common Room. Besides, a water cooler fitted with an ultraviolet water purifier. This comes as a boon to the students during the summer.

• Toilets:

The college has provided toilets in Girls' Common Room and Boys' Common Room. Besides, there is a separate toilet for boys. There are toilets in the Teachers' Common Room, Principal's Room, Conference Room for teachers, Conference Hall, the Central Library and the Office Room. The toilet in the Central Library is specifically meant for the female teachers and staff. All the toilets are cleaned regularly by a sweeper appointed by the college.

• Canteen:

College canteen remains open from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. It is under the supervision of a contractor who is generally an ex-student of this college. There is a Canteen Supervisory Cell which looks after the smooth running of the canteen, regulates the prices of food items and inspects the quality of food items. The canteen has separate sitting arrangement for students and teachers. The college canteen is adjacent to the Indoor Stadium.

• Internet:

Wi-Fi facility has been provided to the students and teachers from 9.00 am to 5.30 pm. The browsing and downloading are free of cost.

• Sports Activity:

The college has its athletics and sports equipments. One part time qualified Physical Education Teacher has been appointed to train the students in football, volleyball,

cricket, gymnastics, high jump, long jump and other games and sports activities.

• **Gymnasium**: The College has a gymnasium with modern equipments and facilities. The Sapatgram College families and the students have the opportunity to utilize the well equipped gym tools.

• Study Tour:

The Departments organize Study Tours for their students to places of historical, cultural and educational importance. The college organizes an environmental Study Tour for the students of 4th Semester as part of their syllabus of Environmental Studies. In such study tours the male and female teachers of the college accompany the students for maintaining discipline among them and to elaborate the historical/cultural/environmental significance of the places visited.

• Literary Activity:

Sapatgram College Magazine is published annually. It publishes the literary writings, views and opinions of students and teachers. Some of the Departments have their Wall Magazines which carry the poems, articles, cartoons and paintings of the students. Some of the Departments publish their Annual Journals which contain the research papers of the students presented in the Seminar Classes. All such efforts are aimed at bringing out the latent creative and critical talent in the budding students.

Quiz and Debate:

There is a Debating Society in the college which organizes debates, extempore speeches and quiz competitions among the students from time to time and prizes are given to the winners on the Final Day Function of the College Week. All such activities are conducted with an aim of bringing out the hidden talent of the students. The students of the college have won prizes in the quiz and debate competitions held at the subdivisional and district levels by the Govt. of Assam.

Music and Dance:

Music and dance are encouraged by the college. Of course, these are not actively promoted by the college because of lack of space and time. Competitions of music and dance are conducted during the College Week and the winners are awarded prizes and certificates on the Final Day Function of the College Week. The recognized singers and dancers are encouraged to perform in different meetings, workshops, seminars and functions of the college. Thus such talent is recognized by the college.

Scouts and Guides:

Scouts and Guides was introduced in the college in 2004. The boys are encouraged to join Scouts as Rovers and the girls are encouraged to join Guides as Rangers. Dr. Padma Guha Agarwala, retired Associate Professor, is the Ranger Leader (H.W.B) and Mr. Abdul Rezzak Sheikh, Assistant Professor, is the Rover Leader. The main motto of Scouts and Guides is to build the students as good citizens by inculcating in them the sense of discipline, sense of self-sufficiency and the value of dignity of labour. The physical activities help the students in shaping their physical health and the cultural

activities bring out the hidden talent in them. The Rangers and Rovers of the college are engaged in maintaining discipline, law and order in the functions of the college and also in the meetings, and functions in the neighboring areas. Miss Nur Akhtara Begum and Ms. Gitarani Kalita were awarded the Rashtrapati Award for Ranger Testing conducted by the National Headquarter, Bharat Scouts and Guides, New Delhi in 2010. They received awards from Mrs. Pratibha Devi Singh Patil, Hon'ble President of India at Rashtrapati Bhavan in 2011. Sri Ratan Roy won the third prize in the Quiz Competition held in the North East Regional Tribal Scouts and Guides Meet at State Training Centre, Agartala, Tripura from 9th to 13th September, 2013.

• National Service Scheme:

Aims and Objectives of NSS

The National Service Scheme (NSS) aims to instill in students a sense of social responsibility, community service, and civic engagement. Its objectives are centered around fostering a sense of community, understanding societal issues, and encouraging personal and social development through volunteer work. Here's a breakdown of the key aims and objectives of NSS:

- 1. **Develop Social Awareness**: Encourage volunteers to understand the needs and problems of the community and identify ways to help.
- 2. **Promote Civic Responsibility**: Instill a sense of duty towards society and encourage active participation in civic life.
- 3. Encourage Leadership and Teamwork: Provide opportunities for volunteers to develop leadership skills and teamwork by engaging in various activities.
- 4. Foster National Integration: Promote unity and integration by bringing together volunteers from diverse backgrounds.
- 5. **Encourage Personal Growth**: Help volunteers develop confidence, empathy, and a sense of purpose through community service.
- 6. **Promote Environmental Awareness**: Engage volunteers in environmental conservation activities to promote sustainability and environmental awareness.

Process of Regulation

The regulation and management of NSS units, like the one at Sapatgram College under Gauhati University, involves a structured approach to ensure effective operation and fulfillment of objectives. Here's an outline of the process:

- 1. **Annual Enrollment**: Each year, the NSS unit admits a new batch of volunteers. In the case of Sapatgram College, 50 volunteers are admitted annually, totaling 100 volunteers.
- 2. **Program Coordination**: The NSS Program Officer (PO) at the college is responsible for coordinating activities, training volunteers, and liaising with the Gauhati University Cell. The PO plays a key role in planning and executing activities.
- 3. **Activity Planning**: The NSS unit plans various activities throughout the academic year, focusing on community service, environmental projects, health camps, literacy programs, and more.
- 4. **Volunteer Training**: Volunteers receive training and orientation to prepare them for community service. This training includes the NSS motto, "Not Me, But You," emphasizing the spirit of selfless service.

- 5. Community Engagement: Volunteers engage in community service activities, working with local communities, schools, and other organizations. These activities are designed to address societal needs and promote social welfare.
- 6. **Monitoring and Evaluation**: The NSS unit monitors and evaluates the effectiveness of its activities. This includes assessing volunteer participation, the impact of activities on the community, and overall program success.
- 7. **Annual Reports**: The NSS unit submits annual reports to Gauhati University Cell, detailing activities, volunteer participation, and outcomes. These reports help maintain accountability and ensure alignment with NSS objectives.
- 8. Recognition and Rewards: Volunteers who demonstrate exceptional commitment and leadership may receive recognition or awards for their contributions. This recognition can motivate volunteers to continue their efforts.

 By following this structured approach, the NSS unit at Sapatgram College contributes to

the overall goals of the National Service Scheme, promoting social responsibility, civic engagement, and community development.

• Students' Union:

Sapatgram College Students' Union Council is the elected body of representatives of the students. Each year the election to the posts of Vice-President, General Secretary, Asst. General Secretary- Major Games, Secretary-Minor Games, Secretary-Debate & Culture, Social Service Secretary, Secretary-Boys' Common Room and Secretary-Girls' Common Room of SCSUC is held in the month of November and the elected representatives assume office and remain in power for one year, i.e. up to the newly elected representatives assume office. The Principal is the President of SCSUC. Teachers are appointed as Professor In-Charge against different portfolios and the Secretaries perform their activities under the active supervision of the teachers.

• Recreation:

The college takes steps in organizing music and dance shows by the students and by experts from outside. Prominent folk- singers are invited to perform before students in order to inculcate in the students a love for their own cultural heritage.

• <u>Discipline:</u>

The college believes that the objective of imparting education to the students and thus transform them into good citizens can be achieved only in a conducive atmosphere for such activities. In that case, the students have to be highly disciplined and punctual. Hence, the college maintains discipline in the campus. A Grade-IV employee at the entry gate does not allow the students without uniform and Identity Card to enter the campus. This is done in order to check the entry of trouble shooters. Any kind of indiscipline in the classroom and in the campus is strictly dealt with. The Class Management and Academic Atmosphere Supervisory Cell take active steps in this regard.

• Departmental Rooms:

Some of the Departments have been provided separate Departmental Rooms and only 4 Departments have been shifted to the newly constructed Teachers' Common Room. Computers have been provided to the Departments and the computers in the newly constructed Teachers' Common Room have been provided Internet facility.

• Career Counseling Cell:

Counseling of students in the choice of subjects in General and Major Courses during admission and in the choice of career options to fresh graduates is an important aspect of every institution of higher education. Sapatgram College has a Career Counseling Cell which organizes counseling of students before admission regarding choice of subjects in General and Major Courses. It also organizes seminars and workshops in career counseling of fresh graduates regarding career options.

• Staff Quarters:

The Principal's Quarters have been built with UGC grant in the college campus. There is a plan to build some staff quarters.

• Communicative English:

The Department of English conducts a 3 months Certificate Course in Communicative English for the interested students. The classes are conducted by the faculty of the Department after regular classes and on Sundays and holidays. The students have to pay only a Registration fee of Rs.200/- for the course which is utilized for purchase of study materials and stationery expenditure. The course is conducted twice in a year and 20 students are selected on the basis of merit and aptitude for each course.

• Computer Centre:

The Computer Centre, situated on the ground floor of the Administrative Building, conducts a number of computer courses. The certificates to the successful students are given by the college. At present there are 24 working computers in the Computer Centre. The centre also successfully conducts PGDCA course under GU (Regular) mode since 2009-10

• Grievance Redressal Cell:

The Grievance Redressal Cell, Sapatgram College remains active throughout the year and remains more vigilant at the commencement of every academic session in order to prevent any kind of ragging of the freshers. There is a Grievance Box in front of the Principal's Office which is opened at 4.00 P.M every day. The Principal, who is the Convener of the Cell, holds a meeting of the cell to discuss the grievances received and the cell tries to redress the grievances of the students.

• Smart Class Room:

At present 3 well equipped fully functional Smart Class Rooms are there in the college.

Some of the ICT classes are held in the room having internet facilities with Interactive Panel, Modern digital Podium, Projectors etc.. Such things have immensely benefited the students.

• Guest House:

The college has constructed a Guest House out of the UGC grants. The Guest House was a necessity of the college in this rural area.

Central Library

Central Library, Sapatgram College has been trying its best to provide efficient service to the readers and its users. The Library has been aiming at supplementing the knowledge of the students which they acquire from their teachers. Central Library, Sapatgram College is well stocked with more than 20,000 thousand texts and reference books, more than a dozen of local and national journals and a few newspapers and other information sources like maps, globes CD-ROMs etc. It also subscribes online journal and books from N-list developed by INFLIBNET, Ahmedabad.

The library is partially automated using Soul 2.0 software developed by INFLIBNET centre. At present library is automated having RFID technology integrated with SOUL 2.0 software. Use of RFID technology enables the users self issue and return facility and web apac facility. From web apac facility users can search the documents available in our library. In RFID technology we have one anti theft gate security system. It is situated on the 1st floor of the Administrative Building with a Reading Hall for students and a Reading Room for teachers. The library follows open access system and it remains open from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM on all working days. Students get membership at the time of their admission in the college. But they have to apply separately to obtain library cards. All teaching and non-teaching staff are also members of the library. Efforts are made to include the alumni and interested people of the local society as members of the Central Library at the cost of caution money.
